
### Teaching Kids to Tell Real News from Fake News

Americans, though, will continue to have one of the lowest life expectancies of any developed country where the average ages of women and men are predicted to be 83 and 80, respectively.

## **Teleworking Blurs Professional and Personal Boundaries**

A new joint study by the UN International Labour Organization (ILO) and Eurofund shows teleworking has positive effects such as better workday organization, higher productivity, and overall better work-life balance.
